

Skelett & Skelett Bold

typefaces by Feòrag NicBhrìde

This is an original typeface and a sibling to Taisean. This time, the German scribes have got hold of the technical pens. The forms are based on blackletter, but the strokes are of constant width. Keeping with the theme, the name is German for “skeleton”.

The character set includes support for virtually every language which can be written in Latin script and includes a selection of ligatures and all the Insular characters. These characters can be accessed by either choosing an appropriate keyboard layout in the International preferences panel, or via the Special Characters.../Glyphs menu option (the name seems to vary depending on the application).

This archive contains the TTF versions of the fonts, which can be used on MacOS X, Linux and Windows. It includes the following files:

- **About Skelett TTF.pdf** - this file.
- **Skelett.ttf** and **Skelett-Bold.TTF** - the font files. In MacOS X, double click on these to see a preview. Click on the “Install Font” button to install.

A PostScript flavoured OpenType version is also available.
